OUR RIGHTEOUS MOTHER EUPHROSYNE

*VENERABLE MARTYR PAPHNOUTIOS OF EGYPT AND THOSE SLAIN WITH HIM
REPOSE OF VENERABLE SERGIOS OF RADONEZH*

St. Sergios of Radonezh is the patron saint of Russia,
Founder of the Holy Trinity Monastery.

After the repose of his parents, the 20-year-old youth went into the deep forest, where he lived a very austere ascetic life, marked by extreme poverty, hard physical labor, and profound humility and simplicity. After a few years of solitude in the forest, disciples started to gather around him, and Russia was forever changed. In St. Sergios' great humility, he rejected all honors: only reluctantly did he accept ordination as priest and appointment as abbot of his own monastery; and he flatly refused to accept the office of Metropolitan of Moscow.

The many spiritual gifts granted to him include powerful and effective prayer, clairvoyance, spiritual direction, and numerous visions.

He reposed in 1392, and his body has remained incorrupt to this day.

Order for Holy Communion

Members of the Orthodox Church age seven and above must prepare for Holy Communion with a recent confession, prayer, fasting from all food and drink from midnight (unless a medical condition preclude it), being in church *before* the Epistle and Gospel readings, and being at peace with everyone.

CHILDREN going to church school and their teachers should come down the center aisle first. (Small children may need to be assisted by their parents.)

ALL OTHERS should wait until an usher dismisses your row from the center aisle. Then return to your place by a side aisle for the prayers of thanksgiving and the final blessing and dismissal. Please let choir members pass when they come down for Communion.

A Warm Welcome to Our Guests

We are glad you are worshipping with us. Please note that participation in **Holy Communion is limited to members of the Orthodox Church** in good standing, who have prepared with prayer, fasting and a recent confession.

For all others: though we cannot share Communion with you—since it is an expression of membership and full unity in faith—you are welcome to come forward after the dismissal, receive a blessing and partake of the blessed bread (from the large bowls). Please also sign our guest book and introduce yourself to Fr. Nabil or Fr. Andrew during coffee hour. You may inquire with them how you can become a member.

Troparion of the Resurrection (Tone 6)

When Mary stood at Thy grave....

Through thee, the divine likeness was securely preserved, O Mother Euphrosyne, for thou didst carry the cross and follow Christ. THE SCRIPTURE LESSONS

Prokeimenon (Psalm 27.9, 1 LXX; Tone 6)

O Lord, save your people, and bless your inheritance.

Verse: To You, O Lord, have I cried, O my God.

From St. Paul's 2nd Epistle to the Corinthians (4.6-15; 15th Sunday)

BRETHREN, it is the God Who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," Who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.

But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. For while we live we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you.

Since we have the same spirit of faith as he had who wrote, "I believed, and so I spoke," we too believe, and so we speak, knowing that He Who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into His presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

**Holy Gospel according to St. Luke
(5.1-11; 1st Sunday Luke)**

AT THAT TIME: Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. And He saw two boats by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, Jesus asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the people from the boat. And when Jesus had finished speaking, He said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." And when they had done this, they enclosed a great shoal of fish; and as their nets were breaking, they beckoned to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." For he was astonished, and all that were with him, at the catch of fish which they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; henceforth you will be catching men." And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed Him.

فِي ذَلِكَ الزَّمَانِ، فِيمَا يَسُوعُ وَاقِفٌ عِنْدَ بُحَيْرَةِ جَنَيْسَارَتِ، رَأَى سَفِينَتَيْنِ وَاقْفَتَيْنِ عِنْدَ شَاطِئِ الْبُحَيْرَةِ، وَقَدْ أَحْدَرَ مِنْهُمَا الصِّيَادُونَ يَعْغِشُونَ الشَّبَاكَ. فَدَخَلَ إِحْدَى السَّفِينَتَيْنِ، وَكَانَتْ لِسِمْعَانَ، وَسَأَلَهُ أَنْ يَتْبَاعِدَ قَلِيلًا عَنِ الْبَرِّ، وَجَلَسَ يُعَلِّمُ الْجُمُوعَ مِنَ السَّفِينَةِ. وَلَمَّا فَرَعَ مِنَ الْكَلَامِ، قَالَ لِسِمْعَانَ: "تَقَدَّمْ إِلَى الْعُمُقِ وَأَلْقُوا شَبَاكَكُمْ لِلصَّبْدِ." فَأَجَابَ سِمْعَانُ وَقَالَ لَهُ: "يَا مُعَلِّمُ، إِنَّا قَدْ تَعَبْنَا اللَّيْلَ كُلَّهُ وَلَمْ نُصِبْ شَيْئًا، وَلَكِنْ بِكَلِمَتِكَ أَلْقِي الشَّبَاكَةَ." فَلَمَّا فَعَلُوا ذَلِكَ، احْتَازُوا مِنَ السَّمَكِ شَيْئًا كَثِيرًا حَتَّى تَحَرَّقَتْ شَبَكَتُهُمْ. فَأَشَارُوا إِلَى شُرَكَائِهِمْ فِي السَّفِينَةِ الْأُخْرَى أَنْ يَأْتُوا وَيُعَاوَنُوهُمْ. فَأَتُوا وَمَلَأُوا السَّفِينَتَيْنِ حَتَّى كَادَتَا تَعْرَقَانِ. فَلَمَّا رَأَى ذَلِكَ سِمْعَانُ بَطْرُسَ، خَرَّ عِنْدَ رُكْبَتَيْ يَسُوعَ قَائِلًا: "أَخْرِجْ عَنِّي يَا رَبُّ، فإِنِّي رَجُلٌ خَاطِئٌ." لِأَنَّ الْإِنْدِهَالَ اعْتَرَاهُ هُوَ وَكُلُّ مَنْ مَعَهُ لِصَيْدِ السَّمَكِ الَّذِي أَصَابُوهُ. وَكَذَلِكَ يَعْقُوبُ وَيُوَحَنَّا ابْنَا زَبْدَى اللَّذَانِ كَانَا رَفِيقَيْنِ لِسِمْعَانَ. فَقَالَ يَسُوعُ لِسِمْعَانَ: "لَا تَخَفْ، فَإِنَّكَ مِنَ الْآنَ تَكُونُ صَيَّادًا لِلنَّاسِ." فَلَمَّا بَلَّغُوا بِالسَّفِينَتَيْنِ إِلَى الْبَرِّ، تَرَكُوا كُلَّ شَيْءٍ وَتَبِعُوهُ.



TODAY'S STUDY TOPIC: LESSON I.19 — THE DEFEAT OF AMALEK, JETHRO ADVISES MOSES, AND THE TEN COMMANDMENTS
